2015 -2016 TERN Funded Projects

- 15-01 -- Outstanding Teacher Award (\$1250) Proposals are received and reviewed and a deserving teacher selected to receive \$1000 for educational supplies, plus a plaque and trip to the EEA conference.
- 15-02 -- Youth Birding Competition (\$7900) Helps cover costs of this popular annual event at CEWC
- 15-03 -- RCW mgt equipment (\$2412) Peeper camera, spotting scopes, binoculars for use by local staff in monitoring RCWs at Moody Forest.
- 15-05 -- LSSI sea turtle technician (\$7142) 22-week tech position has been funded by CBIF for 26 years, but is not able this year. Need stopgap funding until stable arrangement can be arranged for next yr.
- 15-07 -- Camp ACE 2016 (\$8000) Adventures in Conservation Education at CEWC is a 5-day camp with field trips for 20 middle schoolers, who pay \$100 each.
- 15-08 -- Teacher Conservation Workshop 2015 (\$2000) 5-day CEWC forestry and wildlife mgt field workshop for 26 teachers with total cost of \$15605 shared by several partners.
- 15-09 -- Outdoor Wildlife Leadership School (OWLS) 2016 (\$4500) 5-day workshop for 20 educators to experience outdoor activities and training. Each participant pays \$100; total cost \$12500.
- 15-10 -- Camp Teen Adventures Learning Ornithology and Nature (TALON) (\$1860) Focuses on birds, conservation, and coastal ecology. Based at Epworth and visits several sites. Total project cost is \$11360 with GOS and other partners.
- 15-14 -- Anabat acoustic surveys (\$5286) Two Anabat units to further enable statewide citizen science bat surveys and monitoring in the face of white-nose syndrome.
- 15-15 -- Groundcover restoration enhancement for pollinators (\$8500) Find sources and collect seeds from milkweeds, legumes, liatris, and other native plants important to bees and butterflies. Atlanta Botanical Garden will grow seeds under contract for outplanting, and a kiosk will be erected. *Could drop the 2 GPS units and reduce total to \$7700*.
- 15-16 -- Give Wildlife a Chance Poster Contest (\$2650) Continuation of this popular program for students statewide.
